Current Situation

Pakistan is facing a catastrophic flood emergency, with key regions including Buner, Swat, Shangla, Gilgit-Baltistan (GB), and Eastern Punjab experiencing the most severe impacts. The intensity of the monsoon has been heightened by climate change, leading to a 26.5% increase in rainfall in Punjab compared to the previous year.

Official reports from the Disaster Management Authority confirm that 41 districts have been declared calamity-stricken. The current toll stands at 1002 fatalities and 1,208 injuries. The floods have also caused significant agricultural and economic damage, with over 6,509 livestock lost. Infrastructure has been severely impacted, with 9,421 houses destroyed or damaged and over 680 schools affected. A total of more than one million people have been evacuated in Punjab alone, with many seeking refuge in camps or with family, while others remain exposed to the elements without shelter.

Ongoing evacuation efforts have relocated more than one million people in Punjab and about 0.6 million people in Sindh. Many have found temporary safety in relief camps or with relatives, but a significant number of people are still stranded and without shelter, desperately awaiting for aid.

According to Metrological Department, the River Indus at Guddu and Sukkur is currently experiencing a high flood, with this status expected to continue for the next 36 hours. Meanwhile, the River Indus at Kotri has a medium flood level, which is likely to remain until the end of the month. The River Sutlej is in a medium flood at Ganda Singh Wala but a low flood at Sulemanki and Islam, while the River Chenab at Punjnad is at a low flood and is falling. The forecast for the next 24 to 48 hours predicts scattered thunderstorms and rain of moderate intensity over the upper catchments of all major rivers, including areas like Islamabad, Rawalpindi, and Lahore.

Penny Appeal Humanitarian Response

Penny Appeal has consistently focused on delivering life-saving assistance in times of crisis. Earlier in June, it provided urgent support to vulnerable communities in Punjab, and at the onset of the flood emergency in August 2025, it promptly launched a comprehensive response in KP and Punjab.


Recognizing the urgent needs of affected families, Penny Appeal's interventions have included active participation in rescue operations, distribution of cooked meals, provision of clean drinking water, hygiene kits, and medical aid. In addition, the organization has supplied debris removal kits and carried out debris clearance activities to help restore safe access for communities.

So far, Penny Appeal has provided 22,847 Fresh Meals, 109,093 Litres of Safe Drinking Water, provided Medical Aid to 2,786 people and have cleared 6.7 KM road and 664 households through Debris Removal activity and constructed 20 washrooms as well as 20 bathing cubicles in established camps (Bunir). Furthermore, Penny Appeal distributed 300 Debris Removal Kits, 1,136 Hygiene/Dignity Kits, 836 Tarpuline Sheets and 612 Food Pack among flood affected families. Penny Appeal remains committed to reaching the most vulnerable with urgent life-saving support.
