Current Situation

Pakistan is facing one of the severe flooding in the history where regions like Buner, Swat, Shangla, Gilgti Baltistan (GB), and Eastern Punjab have been disproportionately affected. The climate change intensified the monsoon and has brought 26.5% more rainfall than last year in Punjab alone.

The Disaster Management Authority declared 19 districts as calamity hit regions where the death toll has risen to 881 thus far with 1,176 injuries and 6,181 livestock perished. The infrastructure has seen considerable damage where access routes are water logged, 9,206 houses and more than 677 schools are reported fully or partially damaged leaving many families homeless and facing a dire humanitarian situation.

The Disaster Management Authorities have issued evacuation alerts where in Punjab alone more 760,000 people have been evacuated to camps and some have taken shelter with relatives while others are waiting for a helping hand under the open sky.

Till 2nd September, strong monsoon currents and a westerly wave are likely to bring widespread rain with wind/thundershowers across Kashmir, Gilgit-Baltistan, Khyber Pakhtunkhwa, Punjab, Islamabad, Sindh, and Balochistan, with heavy to very heavy falls in several areas. These conditions may trigger flash floods in nullahs/streams, urban flooding in low-lying areas, and landslides in hilly regions, while windstorms and lightning could damage weak structures. The public, travelers, and tourists are advised to remain cautious, avoid vulnerable areas, and stay updated on official weather alerts, while concerned authorities should remain on high alert and take precautionary measures.



Penny Appeal Humanitarian Response

Providing life-saving assistance during emergencies has been the niche of the Penny Appeal while providing immediate assistance in June to communities in Punjab and has initiated the response on the onset of the flood emergency in August 2025.

Realizing the immediate needs, Penny Appeal has been providing support in Rescue Operations, delivering Cooked Meals, Clean Drinking Water, Hygiene Kits, Medical Assistance, Provision of Debris Removal Kits and Debris Removal Operations to restore safe access.

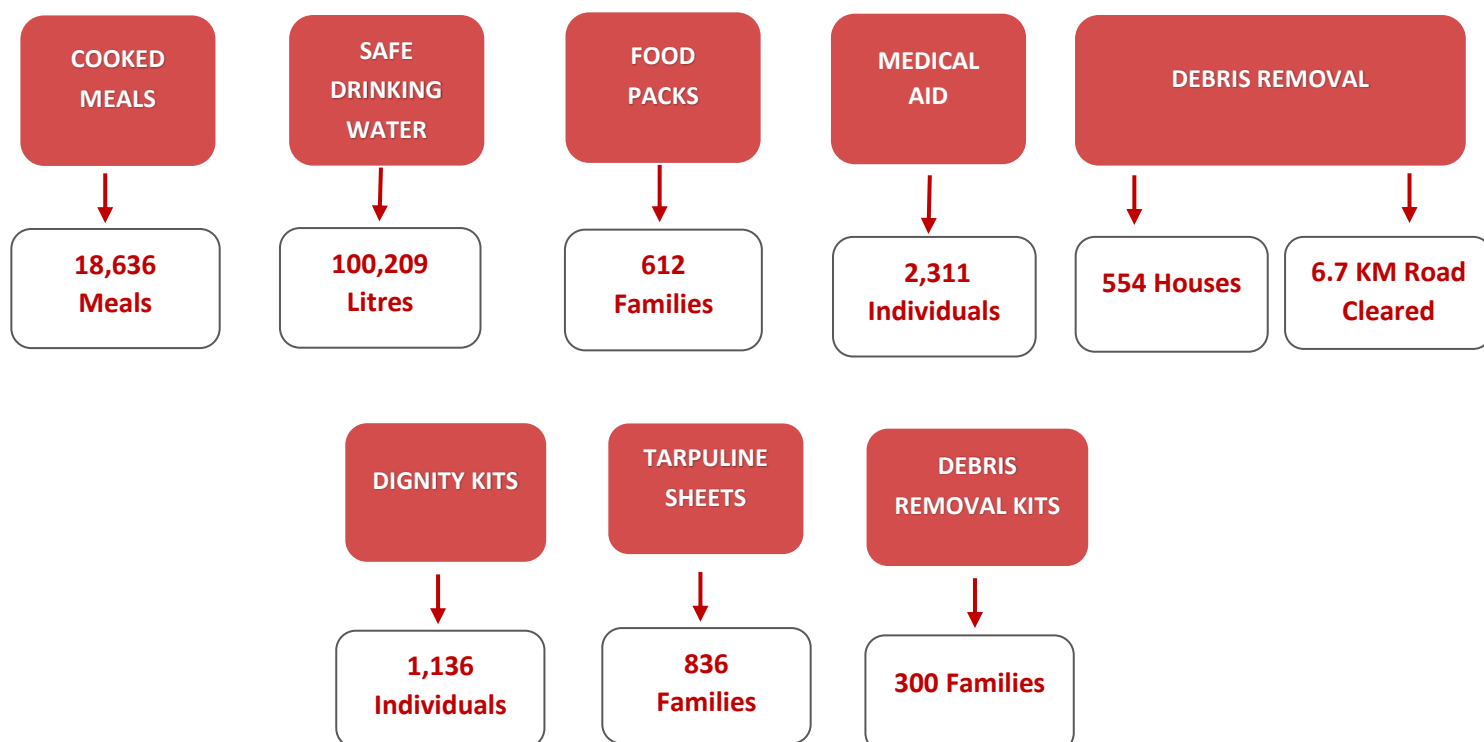
So far, Penny Appeal has provided 18,636 Fresh Meals, 100,209 Litre of Safe Drinking Water, provided Medical Aid to 2,311 people and have cleared 6.7 KM road and 554 households through Debris Removal activity. Furthermore, Penny Appeal distributed 300 Debris Removal Kits, 1,136 Hygiene/Dignity Kits, 836 Tarpuline Sheets and 612 Food Pack among flood effected families.

Penny Appeal remains committed to reaching the most vulnerable with urgent life-saving support.
