## Current Situation

Pakistan is currently experiencing one of the most devastating floods in its history, with areas such as Buner, Swat, Shangla, Gilgit-Baltistan (GB), and Eastern Punjab among the hardest hit. Climate change has amplified the monsoon's intensity, resulting in 26.5% more rainfall in Punjab compared to last year.

According to the Disaster Management Authority, 19 districts have been declared calamity-stricken. So far, 883 lives have been lost, 1,176 people injured, and more than 6,181 livestock swept away. The floods have inflicted extensive damage to infrastructure—roads remain submerged, 9,261 houses destroyed or damaged, and over 677 schools affected—leaving thousands of families displaced and in urgent need of humanitarian assistance.

Evacuation efforts are ongoing, with authorities relocating more than 760,000 people in Punjab alone. While some have sought refuge in camps or with relatives, many others remain stranded under the open sky, awaiting relief.

According to the MET Department, the weather forecast suggests light to moderate rainfall across much of the country during the first week of September, with widespread showers expected on 3rd September 2025 and scattered rains continuing from 4th to 7th September 2025.



## Penny Appeal Humanitarian Response

Penny Appeal has consistently focused on delivering life-saving assistance in times of crisis. Earlier in June, it provided urgent support to vulnerable communities in Punjab, and at the onset of the flood emergency in August 2025, it promptly launched a comprehensive response in KP and Punjab.

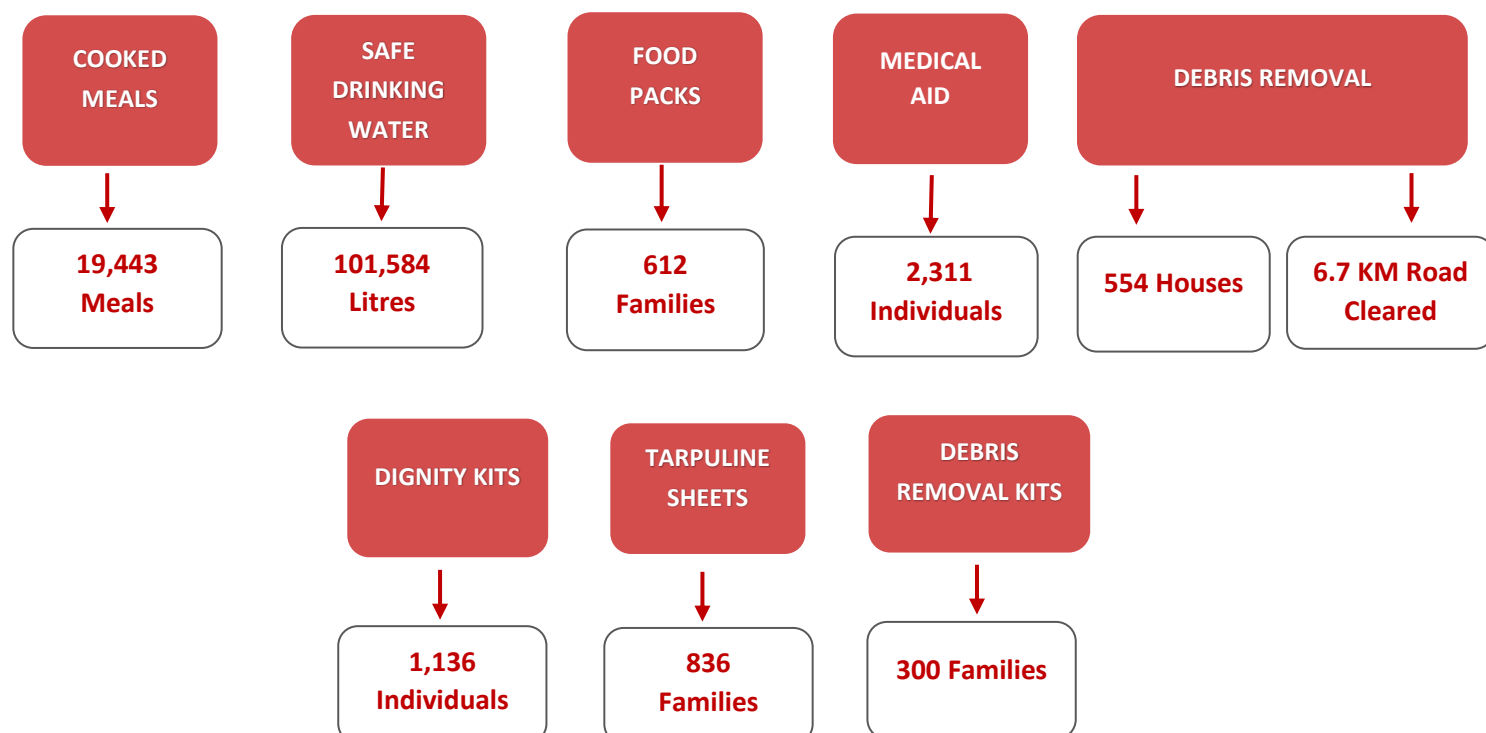
Recognizing the urgent needs of affected families, Penny Appeal's interventions have included active participation in rescue operations, distribution of cooked meals, provision of clean drinking water, hygiene kits, and medical aid. In addition, the organization has supplied debris removal kits and carried out debris clearance activities to help restore safe access for communities.

So far, Penny Appeal has provided 19,443 Fresh Meals, 101,584 Litre of Safe Drinking Water, provided Medical Aid to 2,311 people and have cleared 6.7 KM road and 554 households through Debris Removal activity. Furthermore, Penny Appeal distributed 300 Debris Removal Kits, 1,136 Hygiene/Dignity Kits, 836 Tarpuline Sheets and 612 Food Pack among flood effected families. Penny Appeal remains committed to reaching the most vulnerable with urgent life-saving support.
