

# PAKISTAN FLOODS RESPONSE UPDATES

07 October 2025

## Current Situation

The 2025 floods have left a devastating mark across Pakistan, affecting an estimated 7.10 million people. Official records show that 42 districts have been declared calamity-hit, with over 4,773 villages submerged under floodwaters. The disaster has claimed 1,012 lives and left 1,235 people injured. More than 1.8 million people have been forced to leave their homes, many taking shelter in relief camps or with relatives, while thousands remain stranded and in urgent need of assistance.

The damage to homes, services, and livelihoods is extensive. At least 12,689 houses have been destroyed or severely damaged, leaving families without shelter. Schools have not been spared, with 684 reported damaged, disrupting education for thousands of children. Livestock losses exceed 8,358 cutting off a vital source of food and income for rural households.

The economic cost of the floods is estimated at more than Rs. 500 billion (USD 1.7 billion). Agriculture has absorbed the greatest losses, at around Rs. 302 billion (USD 1 billion). With nearly 1.6 million acres of farmland submerged—much of it in Punjab—farmers have lost both their standing crops and their livelihoods. This large-scale destruction raises serious concerns about food security in the months ahead.

## Penny Appeal Humanitarian Response

Penny Appeal has remained at the forefront of providing life-saving support during emergencies. In June 2025, it extended urgent assistance to vulnerable communities in Punjab. When severe floods struck in August, the organization swiftly expanded its efforts, launching a comprehensive humanitarian response across Khyber Pakhtunkhwa and Punjab.

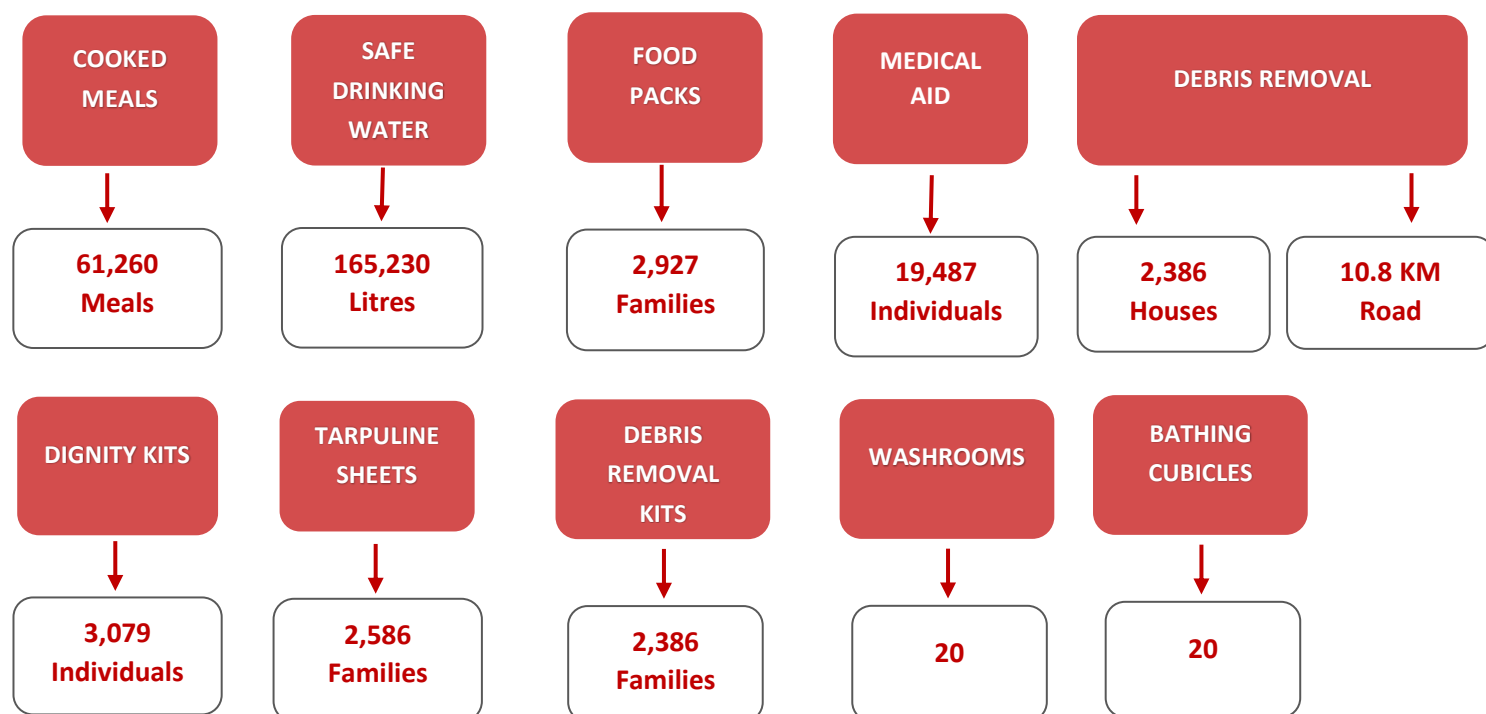
Responding to the immediate needs of affected families, Penny Appeal took part in rescue operations and delivered critical relief. This included the distribution of cooked meals, safe drinking water, hygiene and dignity kits, medical assistance, and shelter materials. To support community recovery, debris removal kits were provided, and clearance activities were carried out to restore safe access routes.

Penny Appeal's response has so far included the distribution of 61,260 fresh meals and 165,230 liters of safe drinking water, along with medical aid for 19,487 people. It has cleared 10.8 kilometers of roads, supported 2,386 households through debris removal, and built 20 washrooms and 20 bathing cubicles in camps in Buner. To further support affected families, 2,386 debris removal kits, 3,079 hygiene kits, 2,586 tarpaulin sheets, and 2,927 food packs have also been distributed.
