Dated: 16 August 2025 Situational Report (#2) on Pakistan Flash Flood 2025

SITUATION OVERVIEW

The rain-triggered floods that affected the country's (especially northern areas Swat, Bunir and GB) on in August which caused severe damages to Human Lives, Livestock and other infrastructure. Over **563 lives** have been lost, including **159 children**, with **768 people** injured and nearly **118 homes damaged or destroyed**. Similarly, Infrastructure, livelihoods, and access to basic services are severely impacted. Penny Appeal, with its established presence and experience in Pakistan, is actively engaged in the emergency response, drawing upon its previous flood relief efforts and long-term development programs.

WEATHER FORECAST

Widespread heavy to very heavy rains are expected across Murree, Galiyat, Islamabad/Rawalpindi, Northeast Punjab, KP, Balochistan, GB, and AJ\&K, likely causing flash floods in local nullahs/streams and hill torrents, particularly in D.G. Khan, Mansehra, Kohistan, Dir, Swat, and Balochistan. Intense downpours may trigger landslides/rockfalls in hilly areas and urban flooding in low-lying parts of Rawalpindi, Gujranwala, Lahore, Islamabad, Sialkot, Sargodha, Faisalabad, Peshawar, and Nowshera. Isolated hailstorms and windstorms pose risks of injuries, damage to crops, orchards, infrastructure, and vehicles, while thunderstorms may increase lightning strike hazards. Electricity and other utilities could face disruption. The public is advised to avoid outdoor exposure during rains and wind, remain cautious of loose structures (billboards, poles, solar panels, etc.), and follow safety advisories. Farmers should plan agricultural activities considering hailstorms, while tourists and travelers in mountainous areas must stay vigilant about flash floods, mud/landslides, and road blockages during this spell.






PENNY APPEAL RESPONSE

Penny Appeal has launched a "Floods Emergency Response" appeal, recognized the severity of the ongoing crisis and reaffirmed its steadfast commitment to supporting the people of Pakistan. As part of this urgent effort, Penny Appeal has delivered immediate humanitarian aid (rescue operation, clean drinking water and cook food) to 7,660 people in Swat and Buner, providing cooked meals, clean drinking water, water trucking, and medical assistance across three districts to ensure vital nourishment and relief for those enduring acute hardship in the aftermath of the floods.
