Situational Report (#3) on Flash Flood 2025

SITUATION OVERVIEW

The rain-triggered floods that affected the country's (especially northern areas Swat, Bunir and GB) on in August which caused severe damages to Human Lives, Livestock and other infrastructure. Over 571 lives have been lost with 768 people injured and nearly 240 homes damaged or destroyed. Similarly, Infrastructure, livelihoods, and access to basic services are severely impacted. Penny Appeal, with its established presence and experience in Pakistan, is actively engaged in the emergency response, drawing upon its previous flood relief efforts and long-term development programs.

The death toll from heavy monsoon rains that have triggered landslides and flash floods across northern Pakistan has risen to at least **315 people.**

Most of the deaths were recorded in the mountainous Khyber Pakhtunkhwa province in northwestern Pakistan, with another five killed in the northern region of Gilgit-Baltistan and nine in AJK.

WEATHER FORECAST

The Meteorological Department has forecasted intensifying monsoon activity across the country from August 17 onwards, with strong currents from the Arabian Sea and Bay of Bengal coupled with a westerly bring expected to widespread wind/thundershowers, heavy to very heavy at times, across Kashmir, Gilgit-Baltistan, Khyber Pakhtunkhwa, Punjab, Sindh, and Balochistan. Torrential rains may trigger flash floods in northern regions, hill torrents in D.G. Khan and eastern Balochistan, as well as urban flooding in major cities including Islamabad, Rawalpindi, Lahore, Gujranwala, Sialkot, Peshawar, Hyderabad, Nowshera, Karachi, and Landslides in hilly areas and windstorms/lightning may also cause damage to infrastructure. Authorities have advised the public, travelers, and tourists to remain cautious, avoid unnecessary exposure in vulnerable areas, and stay updated on weather advisories.





PENNY APPEAL RESPONSE

Penny Appeal has launched a "Floods Emergency Response" appeal, recognized the severity of the ongoing crisis and reaffirmed its steadfast commitment to supporting the people of Pakistan. As part of this urgent effort, Penny Appeal has delivered immediate humanitarian aid (rescue operation, clean drinking water and cook food) to 12,875 people in Swat and Buner, providing cooked meals and clean drinking water across two districts to ensure vital nourishment and relief for those enduring acute hardship in the aftermath of the floods.

Flood Emergency Response in Swat and Buner
