Updated on 10th October 2022

Penny Appeal initiated flood response in the last week of July 2022 when the floods hit Balochistan. Currently, Penny Appeal is responding in 16 districts situated in four provinces of the country. Our major response covers clean and safe drinking water, cooked food, food packages, hygiene kits, medical aid, temporary shelters, and non-food essentials, this has comprised of:

Figures Updated on 10th October 2022

As of 9th October 2022, the NDMA reported that 33 Million population is affected and 84 districts (out of a total of 160 districts) of the country are declared a calamity hit by the current floods. 1,700 people including 728 male, 340 female and 632 children have lost their lives whereas around 13 thousand are reported injured. The flood has washed away more than 13 thousand kilo-meter of roads and 436 bridges across the country.

Over 806 thousand houses are totally destroyed, whereas more than 1.3 Million are damaged.

Over 3.5 Million acres of crops are destroyed. Major crops including cotton, rice, dates and vegetable are severely affected. It is important to note that the up-coming wheat crop will not be cultivated as major agricultural land is under water. This situation will significantly affect the food security and economic stability in the near future.

In addition to the above, around 16,000 schools have been damaged by the floods, which will directly affect 3.5 million school-going children. 1460 health facilities across Pakistan are also affected during the devastating floods.
